

It is the purpose of this Directory to present information about the location and extent of newspaper holdings in Santa Clara County's libraries, museums, historical societies and newspaper publishing companies. A small number of libraries located outside the County also have been included. These were chosen because they have collections which include a substantial number of the County's newspapers.

Few inventories of this type have been published in California. The California State Library is preparing preliminary plans for a Union List of California newspapers to appear in the next year or so. The most recent nation-wide listing appeared in the 1930's and while there is now a concrete plan to update it, estimates are that the project will take at least ten years.

There are no definitions sufficiently clear to guide in the selection of titles in the narrow area between newspapers and periodicals. A very arbitrary decision was made to include many publications, perhaps not in the strictest sense newspapers, if it were felt the contents of the publications contained enough reporting of news to be of use to the researcher. Titles were not eliminated which were of chief interest to narrow interest groups only. It was visualized that the listing would be of use to people who were seeking information about the viewpoints of special groups as well as for those more interested in broader topics.

It has been said that a list of this type serves a two-fold purpose – as a finding aid in helping to locate a specific newspaper and issue for the use of a researcher, and as an inventory function; and in the second, the summing up of the holdings of a group of libraries, there are the implications that may be derived from the inventory. From this listing can be recognized the leading implication – the lack of a systematic policy of collecting newspapers, past and present.

Many of the older newspapers of Santa Clara County have not been kept and few, if any, copies now remain of many others. These older papers have a known value to the researcher but the need for continued collecting is at times less apparent. It recently has been stated that the present day and future seacher will find little of historical value in current County newspapers. This raises questions then of there being little further reason to collect and preserve.

Perhaps the contents of the newspapers will be of less value if the researcher tries to use them as they have been used in the past; but there are a variety of new methods in research and these require a broader range of evidence. There is a new mood of inquiry, a concern for the broad structural characteristics of society, the long-term changes in these characteristics, and a desire to study society as an interacting whole. For example, a great deal of work is being done by medical workers in the field of genetics, and among the sources the newspaper is much used. Also in the field of statistical inquiry there have been some pioneering efforts made in the use of newspaper content. Hopefully, the County newspapers of present day will aid these efforts in the future.

Whatever has been the reason for collecting in the past, there must be coordinated effort in the future with a representative collection of newspapers covering all areas of the County as its goal.

The publishers, many of whom operate marginally profitable enterprises, should be encouraged toward further cooperation by allowing the older papers they presently have to be preserved through microfilming, and to become more aware of the historical value in their current product. The librarians, restricted in their efforts by budgets, must work through a County-wide program to avoid duplication, at least in the newspapers retained. The current cooperation among the library networks could be a further basis for a coordinated policy. There should be more pooling of resources for microfilming as few institutions have complete runs of the older newspapers and even fewer have the funds for individualized projects. Perhaps the bulk of collecting the past, which seems to be more dust than print at this time, must fall on the historical societies and museums. Some attic or old brassbound trunk might yet yield up treasurer beyond belief.

The sources used for this compilation were city, county and institutional histories, city and county directories, local and national newspaper directories, union lists of periodicals, letters, printed talks, pamphlets, periodicals, theses, memoirs, old newspapers, both in print and on microfilm, and other materials too numerous to enumerate. Each institution, almost without exception, was visited several times and if a personal inventory of the collection could be made, it was so done. The holdings were checked through July 1973, and corrections made in this listing.

The cooperation of the personnel of each library, historical society, museum, and newspaper company was given graciously and the supportive attitude of the staff of the Sourisseau Academy for California State and Local History was most helpful. To the co-workers, friends, and relatives whose unflagging enthusiasm and encouragement helped to overcome the problems and tedium of compiling a list of this type, an expression of gratitude is hereby given.

It is the hope of the Sourisseau Academy for California State and Local History, and the compiler, that the HISTORICAL DIRECTORY OF SANTA CLARA COUNTY NEWSPAPERS, 1860-1972, will be found to be useful.

Public use of bound volumes for current year in-office only. Public use of microfilm reader in lobby of newspaper building.

As a part of the Ridder nation-wide chain of publications, the **San Jose Mercury** (morning), **San Jose News** (evening), and the **San Jose Mercury News** (Sunday) are published in San Jose. Titles and frequency have varied. There is a library of clippings and an index dating from about 1925, both restricted to staff usage only. Apparently there is an incomplete run of 19th century volumes; the newspaper is on microfilm from 1900 with a continuing program of microfilming by the company. Restrictions on newspaper usage: No use by anyone other than staff.

Note: The San Jose City Library, in cooperation with the Sourisseau Academy for California State and Local History, has completed its project of microfilming the 1882-1899 portion of the San Jose Mercury available in the Library.

Restrictions on newspaper usage: Use not encouraged.

The listing of newspaper titles that follows is first arranged geographically by city of publication, then alphabetically by title of publication by the first word not a part of the city's name, time of day, or frequency of publication. There are two exceptions: one, if the complete title is the name of the city only, then the title is alphabetized by the first letter of the first word; secondly, if the newspaper title begins with the name of a geographical entity, not the name of the city of publication, then the entity so named is placed alphabetically by the first letter of the first word. The slight variations in format are caused by the different methods of record keeping of the various institutions.

All the loose-bound newsprint is placed first in the listing, alphabetically under each title by identifying symbol designating the individual institutions. The microfilmed material is placed together following the newsprint, also listed alphabetically by symbol.

When a title is not followed by a listing, then no material was found to be extant at this time, or no official collection was located.
